Tenafly is comprised mostly of singlefamily homes, but there are also co-ops, townhomes and condos available.

Sterancsak represents The Plaza at Tenafly, a gated condominium community that has attracted many young families. The 145-unit complex off of Piermont Road features a clubhouse, pool and underground parking. There are only six of the developer's units remaining.

"They range from 1,600 to 2,000

A variety of town-wide events are held throughout the year, such as Memorial Day remembrances, an Easter Egg Hunt, a Halloween Parade and a visit from Santa at Christmastime.

"Tenafly offers many events for its residents, such as a street fair, summer concert series and fireworks," noted Sterancsak.

In addition, the borough's recreation department keeps young people entertained through various sports, such as football, wrestling, softball and basketball, as well as seasonal sports clinics that are open to students in grades K-2.
